2.	UG curriculum	Dean Academic thanked all the Heads of the departments and all the faculty for their efforts and cooperation in revising the curriculum of all the UG programs along with the Minors, Honors programs and open electives. He requested the Heads / faculty nominated by the Heads to give a brief presentation on the curriculum. The revised curriculum of all the UG programs, Minors, Honors and open electives along with PEOs, POs and COs are approved in principle by the senate. However, a few suggestions are given by the senate to the HoDs to verify the following points once again as mentioned below:	
		1. PEOs and POs	
		2. Verify the course structure to comply with the guidelines approved in the 114 th senate meeting with respect to the course codes, structure, MNCs, open electives and internship, structure for Minors and Honors by offering 6 to 9 courses,	
		3. Dept. of ECE is advised to reduce total number of credits for PCC to 81 from 89.	
		4. Departments are advised to list the courses for Honors program and see that they are different from the regular electives offered for B.Tech. program.	



		5. EEE: In order to have uniformity across all the departments, it is advised to shift EE101, EE151 and EE152, Electric circuits lab from ESC to PCC. In the same way, Data structures and Analog Electronics may also be shifted to ESC.		
	PG Diploma	Prof. C. B. Kameswara Rao presented the curriculum for PG Diploma in Pre-Fab Construction.		
		Senate approved the same.		
	5 year Integrated M.Sc. program	Dean Academic requested the HoDs of Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry to present the curriculum for 5 years integrated M.Sc. programs.		
		The structure for 5 years and the common curriculum for the first 3 years presented by HoDs of the science departments are approved by the senate in principle. However, the following suggestions are given by the senate to consider and revise accordingly.

	NCC as Minor program	The curriculum proposed by NCC Group Head Quarters to offer NCC as a Minor program has been presented by the Dean Academic and is approved by the senate. As the eligibility is limited to NCC cadets from Schooling and the program is to be offered right from the 1 st semester, the following are approved:		
		 Eligibility: The students who are the cadets of NCC at school level are only eligible and hence the CGPA eligibility for this Minor is relaxed. Starts from First Semester: The Minor course is in line with the regulations of other Minor programs offered by the Institute, However the program starts from I Year, I Sem and completing by III Year, II Semester 		



Credits for Practical training: The credit for NCC- Practical is also to be considered equal to that of L (T) because of the intensity of the training in Practical and Camps.
Senate advised to consider the courses under NCC program as the workload for the faculty handling.
