



	To confirm the minutes of 54 th meeting of Senate held on 15 th and 16 th June 2012.	Confirmed
0	To approve the results of First Semester of UG, PG & Ph.D. programs for the academic year 2012-2013.	i)The Senate deliberated on the grades submitted by various departments through their respective DACs and observed that there are certain disparities followed in the grading scheme. The Departments were advised to reconsider the grading in the following subjects in their respective DACs and authorized Chairman, Senate to approve the modified grades. Senate has approved the results of all other subjects. II B.Tech: Dept. of EED: EE201,EE202,EE203 and CS 236 Dept. of Civil Engg:CE203 Dept. of Civil Engg:CE203 Dept. of MME: MM 202, MM204 Dept. of CSE: All the subjects Dept. of Biotechnology: BT 203. III B.Tech: Dept. of Mech. Engg: ME303 Dept. of Chemical Engg: CH 301 and CH 303. Dept. of MME: MM 202,MM204 Dept. of CSE: EC321,CS304,CS305 Dept. of Biotechnology: BT 303. IV B.Tech: Dept. of EE: EE201,EE202,EE203 and CS 236 Dept. of Civil Engg: CE203 Dept. of Civil Engg: CE203 Dept. of CSE: All the subjects Dept. of Siotechnology: BT 203. ii) The Senate deliberated on the issue relating to evaluation in two subjects for IV B. Tech CSE. It is observed that the faculty members have not conducted the minor tests and have evaluated the students for a total of 80 marks. The senate recommended for an administrative action on the two faculty members. However, approved to grade the students based on the 80 marks obtained by the students as a special case.



iii) The Senate observed that in few of the laboratory courses offered by few departments, the evaluation was done for a total of 50 marks. However, the Senate directed that the evaluation for each course, whether theory or lab be ensured to be 100.

iv)Absolute grading system was followed in arriving at the grades of the PG courses. Dean, Academic presented the statistics (Dept.wise) on the list of students who failed to get SGPA of 6.5. The Senate deliberated at length on the issue and directed the departments to follow the bunching rules and to lower the lower cut-offs of the grades with justification and authorized Chairman to approve the modified grades.

v)Senate has deliberated on the issue of M. Tech Students who become ineligible to get full stipend because of low SGPA and resolved to pay Rs. 5000 per month to all such students who have a SGPA of at least 5.0 and to pay arrears as and when they get the requisite SGPA / CGPA.

3. Restricting / Rationalizing Communication B. Tech./M. Tech. seats.

It is proposed to restrict / rationalize intake into B.Tech. and M.Tech. programs as detailed below. If approved by the Senate the same will be submitted to BOG for its consideration and recommendation to MHRD for approval.

(a) It is proposed to restrict the number of seats for admission into B.Tech. under ICCR scheme to 26 as detailed below:

Civil Engineering, Electrical & Electronics
Engineering, Mechanical Engineering,
Electronics & Communication
Engineering and Computer Science and
Engineering – 4 each.


Metallurgical & Materials Engineering, Chemical Engineering and Biotechnology – 2 each.

(b) It is proposed to rationalize the intake into B.Tech. Programmes through AIEEE / JEE by retaining the total intake into the Institute at 740.


At present the annual intake into various B. Tech Programmes isas follows:


