BEST FACULTY AWARDS 2017

NIT Warangal jointly with Alumni Association honors meritorious faculty for extraordinary contributions to teaching, research and to the student experience of life within the Institution. Faculty from across the institution will be considered. All cadres of faculty are eligible, but preference is usually given to those with professorial titles. The candidate faculty should have a long history with the Institute and have made significant contributions. Their contributions at NIT Warangal are mainly considered for these awards. The following categories of awards will be presented on Teachers Day to be celebrated on 5th September 2017. Any faculty member is eligible to get either a best faculty award or a best researcher award in a given year.

1.0 Best Faculty Awards

1.1 Introduction

The Best Faculty Awards are presented annually to outstanding full-time faculty members in recognition of extraordinary contributions to teaching and to the student experience of life within the Institution. The Best Faculty Awards are to recognize faculty who have contributed significantly to the intellectual life of the Institute through their teaching over a long time. Recipients of the award will have demonstrated their excellence as educators over a sustained period of time. All cadres of faculty are eligible, but preference is usually given to those with professorial titles. The Best Faculty Award highlights NITW's commitment to teaching excellence. Although scholarly distinction is the primary qualification, emphasis is placed on the evidence of quality teaching including the directing of graduate research, and service to the institute and academic community.

1.2 Eligibility

Only full-time faculty members with at least ten years of service at NITW, with age above 40 years (i.e. born before 01-01-1977), who currently hold one of the following titles, Professor, Associate Professor, Assistant Professor, are eligible. Faculty members are eligible to get this award only once in service at NITW.

1.3 Criteria

Faculty contributions in the following aspects during the last 10 years of service will be taken into account for evaluation. Faculty member, who scores at least 60 marks are only considered for these awards.

2.0 Best Researcher Awards

2.1 Introduction

The Best Researcher Award is presented annually to outstanding full-time faculty members, with doctoral degree, in recognition of extraordinary research contributions in their field of study. The Best Researcher Award is to recognize faculty who have contributed significantly to the advancement of science and technology through their consistent research activities over a long time. All cadres of faculty are eligible. The Best Researcher Award highlights NITW's commitment to innovation and research excellence.

2.2 Award Categories and Eligibility

The following categories of awards are instituted.

2.2.1 Best Engineering Researcher Award (For senior Faculty Members; Age: above 40 years i.e. born before 01-01-1977)

Faculty member should have a track record of good researcher, with more than 10 years of service, out of which at least 5 years after PhD, in NIT Warangal with age more than 40 years. He/she should be a permanent faculty member of any one of the engineering departments. He/she should have executed at least one externally funded R&D Project and at least one Ph.D. should have been awarded under his/her guidance. Faculty members are eligible to get this award only once in service at NIT Warangal.

2.2.2 Best Science Researcher Award (For senior Faculty Members; Age: above 40 years i.e. born before 01-01-1977)

Faculty member should have a track record of good researcher, with more than 10 years of service, out of which at least 5 years after PhD, in NIT Warangal with age more than 40 years. He/she should be a permanent faculty member of any science department or humanities department or school of management. He/she should have executed at least one externally funded R&D Project and at least one Ph.D. should have been awarded under his/her guidance. Faculty members are eligible to get this award only once in service at NIT Warangal.

2.3 Criteria for Best Researcher Awards

Faculty member will be evaluated on the following aspects during the last 10 years for these awards. Faculty members, who score at least 60 marks are only considered for these awards.

3.0 Young Researcher Awards

3.1 Introduction

The Young Researcher Award is presented annually to outstanding full-time faculty members, with doctoral degree, in recognition of extraordinary research contributions in their field of study at a younger age. The Young Researcher Award is to recognize faculty who have contributed significantly to the advancement of science and technology through their consistent research activities. All cadres of faculty are eligible. The Young Researcher Award highlights NITW's commitment to innovation and research excellence.

3.2 Award Categories and Eligibility

The following categories of awards are instituted.

3.2.1 Young Engineering Researcher Award (Age: less than or equal to 40 years i.e. born on or after 01-01-1977)

A permanent faculty member of any one of the engineering departments with 5 years of experience post PhD at NIT Warangal with age less than or equal to 40 years, having good track record of research contribution is eligible for this award. He/she should have at least one ongoing / executed externally funded R&D Project or at least one Ph.D. should have been awarded under his/her guidance. Faculty members are eligible to get this award only once in service at NITW.

3.2.2 Young Science Researcher Award (Age: less than or equal to 40 years i.e. born on or after 01-01-1977)

A permanent faculty member with 5 years of experience post PhD at NIT Warangal with age less than or equal to 40 years, having good track record of research contribution is eligible for this award. He/she should be a permanent faculty member of any science department or humanities department or school of management. He/she should have at least one ongoing / executed externally funded R&D Project or at least one Ph.D. should have been awarded under his/her guidance. Faculty members are eligible to get this award only once in service at NITW.

3.3 Criteria for Young Researcher Awards

Faculty member will be evaluated on the following aspects during the last 5 years for these awards. Faculty members, who score at least 60 marks are only considered for these awards.

- The office of Dean (IRAA) will receive nominations which will be reviewed, validated and short listed by a Screening Committee (SC)

chaired by the Dean (IRAA) to be constituted with the approval of the Director.

- The Dean (IRAA) will place the short listed nominations before the Faculty Award Selection Committee (FASC).
- The FASC make every effort to select recipients of the highest calibre, giving equal consideration to all who have achieved excellence.

5.0 Last Date for Submission of Applications

All the interested faculty members are required to submit their applications in the prescribed format for consideration to the above faculty awards on or before 5.30PM on 11th August 2017 to the Dean (IRAA). Filled in application in all respects, with required enclosures should be routed through the respective HOD, with his/her recommendations. These awards will be presented in Teachers Day Celebration function to be held on 5th September 2017.
